





## LINNY FOWLER PROFILE IN PHILANTHROPY

Marlene "Linny" Fowler, who passed away in 2013 at the age of 73, was a Lifetime Trustee and an indispensable figure in shaping the Da Vinci Science Center's development. In the Center's formative years, when it spun off from Lehigh University to become an independent nonprofit organization, Linny's generosity supported Center operations to ensure that the Lehigh Valley would have a hands-on science center. In 2005, she and her husband, Beall, provided the lead private gift to support the construction of a new facility on the campus of Cedar Crest College. Deeply committed to children and education, Linny contributed countless hours and resources to ensure that children of the Lehigh Valley would enjoy hands-on science experiences for decades to come. In 2017, the Da Vinci Science Center honored Linny post-humously with the Lifetime Achievement Award in recognition of her passion for the Center's mission to bring science to life and lives to science. Like Leonardo da Vinci himself, her exemplary life in the arts and sciences is an inspiration.



## KARENANGELLO, PH.D. PROFILE IN VOLUNTEER LEADERSHIP

Karen S. Angello, Superintendent of the Allentown School District from 2002-2010, served on the Center's Board of Trustees from 2002-2009 and from 2010-2015 and was the Board's Secretary from 2006-2008. A tireless advocate for education and STEM, Karen served on a number of Da Vinci Science Center committees, including Education, Development, Human Resources, Strategic Planning, and Teacher Hall of Fame Awards.

During her 47 years in public education, she has had varied experiences in teaching, administration, staff development, strategic planning, research and evaluation and special education. Her passion has always been to ensure that all students have the opportunity to have quality learning experiences.

In addition to the Da Vinci Science Center Board of Trustees, Dr. Angello served on the following boards: Allentown Art Museum, Bach Choir, Business Education Partnership, Communities-in-Schools, United Way of the Greater Lehigh Valley, and the Founding Board of the Promise Neighborhoods of the Lehigh Valley.

Karen has always credited her many mentors for her broad and varied career experiences. In return, she has always been willing to provide support to both adults and students in meeting their goals.

The Da Vinci Science Center Board of Trustees and staff wish to pay tribute to Ed Donley, who passed away in 2017 at the age of 95. Mr. Donley was instrumental to the Center's development in the early years and a strong proponent of the Center's efforts to act boldly with regional partners to build a PreK-12 STEM pipeline to meet the growing demand of for a skilled workforce in high value industries.. Mr. Donley received the Center's first Lifetime Achievement Award in 2015.

A consummate champion for education and community development, Mr. Donley was an instrumental leader of numerous regional and national efforts.

The Donleys were early supporters of Da Vinci, investing in the position of Senior Director of Science and Strategy to ensure the Center would have a recognized leader in science education on staff. The Donley Foundation provided the lead gift for development of a regional plan for STEM education and more recently, was an early investor in our new preschool exhibit area featuring "Engineers on a Roll."



### LEONARDO'S HORSE AT THE ASPEN INSTITUTE

In anticipation of Walter Isaacson's book, Leonardo da Vinci, the Society of Fellow at the Aspen Institutte in Aspen, CO, hosted an event in August to celebrate the life and creative genius of Leonardo da Vinci. The event, aptly named "Leonardo da Vinci: A Celebration of Wonder, Imagination, and the Creative Power of Curiosity", was attended by Lin Erickson, Executive Director and CEO of the Da Vinci Science Center, along with the Center's prized three-foot-tall replica of Leonardo's Horse.

While on the Aspen Institute campus, Lin presented the story behind Leonardo's vision for "Il Cavallo," which was never realized during his lifetime but came to life five hundred years later through the dream of the late Charles C. Dent of Allentown, PA and the organization he founded, Leonardo da Vinci's Horse, Inc. (LDVHI). Lin's presentation examined the artistic, technological, and historical significance of Leonardo da Vinci's Horse and featured the creative process employed by Dent and LDVHI to make the Horse a reality.

## Vincent Sorgi A CHALLENGE MATCH FOR EXPANSION

In November, 2016, the Da Vinci Science Center partnered with the City of Easton to explore building a second location along the city's scenic waterfront area. Vince Sorgi, current Chairman of the Center's Board of Trustees, made several quiet, early leadership gifts to empower the Da Vinci team to begin that important planning process. Realizing that these early funds would be most difficult to raise, Vince boldly challenged his fellow trustees to step forward with their personal gifts to support the planning period, and promised that he would match any new gifts up to a total of \$100,000. This led to an amazing accomplishment. In one month's time, 100% of the Board committed more than \$400,000 to support expansion planning. These Board gifts were in addition to trustees' annual support for Center operations. During his tenure as a trustee, serving as Treasurer, Vice Chairman, and now Chairman, Vince has encouraged the board and staff to think strategically. He has been and continues to be the Center's biggest champion, and the organization would not be where it is today without his leadership.






